Due Care & The CPSC Standards

- Due Care is the standard of conduct that a *Reasonably Prudent Person* would observe in a given situation.
- Adequate Due Care can be determined by answering two questions:
 - Did the park owner/staff do something they should not have done?
 - Did the park owner/staff fail to do something they should have done?
 - > If the answer to either of these questions is 'YES' then the park owner has failed to provide 'Due Care'

- The average campground/park playground claim costs \$11,200
- Over ten years one in every two campgrounds will have a playground claim

- Playground Safety Data Collected Since 1970's
- 40% of playground injuries are related to supervision issues
- 50% of claims occurred because of broken equipment
 - Swings are the most common piece of broken equipment to cause injury

- 208,000 children receive emergency care for playground-related injuries each year
 - 17 resulted in death
 - 1/3rd classified as severe,
 with fractures being most
 prominent
- Every 2 ½ minutes a child is injured on a playground in the United States

• If a child hits hard surface material from a height of 8 feet, it is similar to hitting a brick wall at 30mph in an automobile.






- In the past ten years, Evergreen has seen over a dozen playground claims that cost more than \$50,000
 - Four of these were over \$100,000
 - Two of these were over \$200,000
- Non CPSC approved equipment is nearly 20 times more likely to result in an award to the plaintiff





Common Repairs & Issues



- 12 Hazards to Be

 Aware Of
- Repairs
- Review / Inspection

- Improper Ground Cover
 - At least 6" to 12" in depth
 - Consult CPSC standards

- Sand
- Fine Gravel
- Wood Chips
- Mulch
- Rubber Matting
- Pea Stone

- 2. Fall Zones
 - Covered with SoftGround Cover
 - No Other Equipment in Area

- Minimum of Six feet in all Directions
- Slides Higher than
 Four Feet the Fall Zone
 is height of slide plus
 four feet
- Swings should have a Fall Zone in front & behind that extends two times the height of the swing hanger

3. Protrusion & Entanglement Hazards



- Ends of Bolts
- Metal Braces thatCould Impale or Cut AChild
- Nothing should catch loose clothing

- 4. Entrapment in Openings
 - No openings greater than 3 ½" but less than 9"

- Slide
- Platforms
- Climbers
- Ladders

- 5. Spacing of Equipment or Use Zone
 - Do Not Overcrowd Equipment
 - Do Not Overlap Fall Zones
 - Improper Traffic Flow
 - Minimum Twelve Feet Between Play Structures
 - Try to Keep Swings and Other Moving Equipment Away from Permanent Fixtures



Use Zone – "Total space under and around installed equipment that is necessary for the user to complete the intended activity.

12 Hazards to Be Aware Of ~Use Zone Separation~

- 5. Spacing of Equipment or Use Zone
 - Do Not Overcrowd Equipment
 - Do Not Overlap Fall Zones
 - Improper Traffic Flow
 - Minimum Twelve Feet Between Play Structures
 - Try to Keep Swings and Other Moving Equipment Away from Permanent Fixtures



Use Zone – "Total space under and around installed equipment that is necessary for the user to complete the intended activity.

- 6. Trip Hazards
 - Concrete Footings
 - Abrupt Surface Changes
 - Containment Borders
 - Tree Roots
 - Tree Stumps
 - Rocks

- 7. Lack of Supervision
 - Design so Supervision is Easy
 - Benches & Picnic Tables
 Nearby
 - Easy Viewing ThroughoutPlay Area





- 8. Age Appropriate Activities
 - Appropriate Age for Intended Use
 - Post User's Age
 - At Playground
 - On Playground Rules
 - Policy & Rules Given at Registration
 - # Color Code Equipment
 - Pre-School Equipment
 Separate from School Age





- 9. Lack of Maintenance
 - Preventive Maintenance Program
 - Inspect for Hazards Daily



10. Pinch, Crush, Shearing & Sharp Edge Hazards

- No Sharp Edges
- Check Moving Items
 - Bridges
 - Track Rides
 - Merry-Go-Rounds
 - See-Saws
 - Swings

- 11.Platforms without Guardrails
 - Ø Bridges
 - Ramps
 - Bridge ways
 - Walkways
- Ages 2-5 Anything over 20"
- Ages 6-12 Anything over 30%

- 12. Equipment Not Recommended for Playgrounds
 - Non CPSC Approved Equipment
 - Heavy swings
 - Animal Figure Swings
 - Double Occupancy Glider Type Swings
 - Free Swinging Ropes that May Fray
 - Dual Exercise Rings & Trapeze Bars
 - Trampolines





Repairs

- Cracked, Worn, and Bowing Components Should be Replaced (33)
- All Moving Parts Should be Lubricated (4)
- Replace Damaged or Loose Swing Seats (92)

Repairs

- Replace Worn Chains (14)
- Clamp/Tighten "S" Hooks (29)
 - "S" Hooks Need aMinimum Load Rating of600 lbs
- Make Sure Ground Cover is Maintained Properly (104)

- See Saw Place Half
 Buried Tires Under
 Seats to Absorb Shock
 - Spinal Injuries
 - Crushed Legs & Feet



Review/Inspection

- Youth Swings
 - Totally Encompassed or
 - Manufactured
 Restraining Strap that
 Carne Attached to Swing
 - X Do Not Add a Strap if
 Strap Has Broken Unless
 Manufacturer Approved



Review/Inspection

- Merry-Go-Round
 - Not appropriate for Children Under Six
 - Must Have a ClosedFrame Base



Review/Inspection

- Make Sure Equipment is Being Used Properly and Correct Improper Actions
- Conduct Daily Inspections
 - Watch for Vandalism
- Keep Re-Order Sheets on File
 - Swing Seats
 - Parts List
 - Manufacturers
